
Other Common DUI-related Offenses

<u>Child Endangerment (DUI with minor in car)</u>. Depending on facts, will be class D or class B felony.

Reckless Endangerment with Vehicle. Class E felony.

<u>Vehicular Assault.</u> Class D Felony. License revoked for 1 - 5 years. Restricted license is NOT available.

<u>Vehicular Homicide</u>. Depending on facts, may be class B, C, or D felony. Cannot drive in TN for 3 - 10 years.



DUI IS EXPENSIVE



A DUI conviction will cost you: probation fees, drug test fees, interlock fees, and higher insurance rates on top of court costs and fines.

CRIMINAL RECORD



DUI is not expungable. It will be on your record FOREVER.

DUI PROBATION



You must complete all requirements & have clean drug/alcohol tests.
If you don't, you may have to serve your sentence in jail!
